MAJOR GENERAL (RETD) TIM FORD, AO

Tim Ford retired from the Australian Army in 2003, following an extensive career in the Australian Defence Force and the United Nations.

From 1998 until 2002, Major General Ford served in a number of high-ranking United Nations peacekeeping appointments including as the Head of Mission of the United Nations Truce Supervision Organisation (UNTSO) in the Middle East, and as the Chief Military Adviser in the Department of Peacekeeping Operations at UN Headquarters, New York.



From 2005, Tim was the Chair of the Australian Peacekeeping Memorial Project, which was dedicated on Anzac Parade, Canberra on 14th September 2017, the 70th anniversary of Australian peacekeeping. Tim is currently the Director Peace and Security in the United Nations Association of Australia (NSW Division).
